



KINGS PARK

Introduction

1. Kings Park is the parkland on the northern foreshores of Lake Burley Griffin, between Commonwealth Park and Kings Avenue, the western boundary being the eastern edge of the Rond Terraces.
2. The various points of interest within the Park are as follows:
 - a. Blundells' Cottage,
 - b. the HMAS Canberra Memorial, and
 - c. the Merchant Navy Memorial.

Booking a Venue

3. Bookings for a venue may be made through the National Capital Authority's Events Officer on (02) 6272 2919.

Blundells' Cottage

4. Blundells' Cottage is a popular tourist attraction and visitors may wander freely through the Cottage or be taken on a guided tour by National Capital Authority volunteer staff from the National Capital Exhibition. Requests with regard to internal access and use of the Cottage are to be directed to the Authority staff at the Exhibition on (02) 6257 1068.
5. Whilst weddings cannot be conducted in the Cottage itself they and photo sessions, may be held in the Cottage Grounds and in the vicinity immediately outside the Grounds. Requests are to be directed to the National Capital Authority's Unit Events Officer on (02) 6272 2919.

Access

6. Vehicle entry into the Park is along Wendouree Drive, which runs off Constitution Avenue between Anzac Park East and Creswell Street, Campbell.
7. Unless otherwise authorised, all vehicles are to remain on the existing defined roads and are to park in authorized car parks.

Car Parks

8. The only authorised car parking areas in the Park are as follows:
 - a. adjacent to Aspen Island: 39 vehicles;
 - b. Blundells' Cottage: 14 vehicles; and
 - d. the Park's barbecue area: 9 vehicles.

Power

9. There are two power source outlets in the Park. The outlets are located at the following locations:

Area	Power Type	Qty
Barbecue	3 x double 15 amp 240 v / 1 x 3 phase 32 amp 415 v	1
Car Park (adjacent to toilets)	2 x double 15 amp 240 v	1

10. There is no charge for the use of the outlets and the keys are available from the National Capital Authority's Events Officer on (02) 6272 2919. A bond of \$25 is levied on keys issued by the Authority and the bond is refunded when keys are returned to the Authority by the agreed time.

Water

11. A fresh water tap is situated at the Park's barbecue.

Public Toilets

12. The public toilets within Kings Park are located near the HMAS Canberra Memorial, north of Aspen Island. The toilets are available from 7.00 am to 7.00 pm (9.00 pm during daylight saving).

Barbecues

13. There is an electrical barbecue in the Park, located in the vicinity of the toilet block.

Structures

14. Structures (works) may be erected within Kings Park; however, any proposed structures are to be submitted to the National Capital Authority on a Works Approval for an Event application form, accompanied by a detailed map showing the exact location of the proposed works. Structures (works) include marquees, tents, sun-shelters, fencing, barricades, amusements (eg. jumping castles), stages, dais's, signs, banners, port-a-loos, buoys etc. A works request normally incurs a Works Application Fee.

15. Applications for a works approval may be obtained from the National Capital Authority's Events Officer on (02) 6272 2919.

Camping

16. Camping in the Park, day or night, is not permitted.
