



## **SPRINGBANK ISLAND**

### **Introduction**

1. Springbank Island is located in Lake Burley Griffin's West Basin and the only means of access is across the Lake by boat. The perimeter of the Island is lined with trees, however, other than the treed picnic area and shelter (at the western end of the Island) the Island is quite bare.

### **Booking a Venue**

2. Bookings for venue may be made through the National Capital Authority's Events Officer on (02) 6272 2919.

### **Access**

3. Access to the Island may be by either private licensed vessels or through one of the commercially operated ferries.

### **Power**

4. There is no power source outlet available for the public on the Island.

### **Water**

5. There is access to fresh water on the Island, at both the barbecue and at the toilet block.

### **Public Toilets**

6. There is a public toilet on the Island, which is always open.

### **Barbecues**

7. There is a two-burner electric barbecue situated on the western side of the Island.

### **Structures**

8. Structures (works) may be erected on the Island; however, any proposed structures are to be submitted to the National Capital Authority on a Works Approval for an Event application form, accompanied by a detailed map showing the exact location of the proposed works. Structures (works) include marquees, tents, sun-shelters, fencing, barricades, amusements (eg. jumping castles), stages, dais's, signs, banners, port-a-loos, buoys etc. A works request normally incurs a Works Application Fee.

9. Applications for a works approval may be obtained from the National Capital Authority's Events Officer on (02) 6272 2919.

### **Camping**

10. Camping on the Island, day or night, is not permitted.

### **Emergency Telephone**

11. The Island has an emergency telephone, which is situated adjacent to the jetty (on the southern side of the Island).
